WORSHIP THEMES

Sunday of the Passion / Palm Sunday (April 1)

The procession with palms brings us into Holy Week and the celebration of the mystery of our salvation. We enter the week by hearing the story of Jesus' passion — his suffering and death. In baptism we have been fused to this story; in Holy Week we make our way through it again, because it brings us to life with Christ.

Resurrection of Our Lord, Easter Sunday (April 8)

The Lord is risen indeed! The open tomb of Jesus is the door to a new way of being in the world. Easter is not one day but fifty. For a week of weeks — fifty days — the church will explore the dimensions of this new life and raise a joyful alleluia!

Second Sunday of Easter (April 15)

These first weeks of Easter focus our attention on appearances of the risen Lord. It is not always easy to see Jesus after his resurrection. The gospel will remind us that Jesus has a new body in which he now lives. As we gather this day to greet each other and share the peace of the Lord, may our eyes be opened to discern that we are looking at the risen body of Christ!

Third Sunday of Easter (April 22)

Resurrection also means reconciliation. In today's gospel, Peter's denials are trumped by a threefold commissioning from Jesus. We, too, are reconciled to one another and to God as we join in the hymn of all creation with angels and archangels and all the company of heaven: "Worthy is the Lamb who was slain!"

Fourth Sunday of Easter (April 29)

With the fourth Sunday of Easter the gospel readings turn away from resurrection appearances of Jesus and begin to focus on echoes of Jesus' earlier words that had pointed toward his death and resurrection during his ministry. He meant to go this path all along. As we listen to Jesus' words from the tenth chapter of John's gospel, we learn that Jesus is both shepherd as well as the victorious Lamb. Peter is a shepherd like Jesus as he leads one of Jesus' sheep from death to life.

Council Update

Pastor Eichhorn led the group in laying out a plan for developing an Evangelism Committee, and led us in prayer.

Don Hartman and Donna Gorrell discussed the budget, and noted that although the congregation giving rate is similar to 2006, we are currently carrying about a \$5000 deficit against the budget.

440 thousand dollars (362k from the sale of 174 Lookout Drive, plus 78k from a certificate of deposit) has been moved into an investment account, in planning for financing of the Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning Project. (Work for the HVAC Project begins April 9, and planned completion is July 13, in time for Vacation Bible School, which is scheduled July 30-August 3.)

Doug Hammer outlined a time-line for the fund drive for HVAC, developed by a hard working committee. The fund drive begins April 1, and direct donations for HVAC replacement and pledges will be sought. Youth groups and other small groups are challenged to participate. Thanks go out to the individuals already donating directly to this project. Please keep the leaders of this project in your prayers, as it involves a lot of work and planning.

Pastor Eichhorn shared a 6 minute video-presentation, "Shift Happens," which outlined the exponential change of technology in our world, and how it may translate change within LCOS. One of the challenges for LCOS is to keep up with new forms of communication that come with the changes in technology, and which tend to be embraced by younger generations.

Pastor Eichhorn has been meeting with Peggy Karnes, and others, in planning for the Peace Theme and Peace curriculum for this next year.

Rachel Spry, Family Ministry Coordinator, is planning the start up of a small group in June for mothers of small children.

Renovations to the second floor of the Parish House are beginning now, to replace water damage from leaking pipes earlier this winter.

Property Committee has engaged a new cleaning crew for LCOS.

Pastor Eichhorn noted that we are seeking two members to attend the Synod Conference in Columbus on June 1 and 2.

at www.elca.org/gme . Watch your mail for more details concerning our participation in the event.

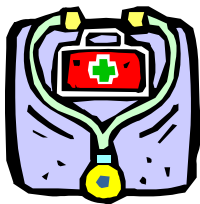

INTERNET ADDICTION:

How can it hurt you?

It can cause problems at home, school or work. It can also damage your real-life relationships, causing distrust from family and friends. It is very expensive and can cause financial difficulties. You may also become addicted to Internet shopping and spending, or gambling.

Tell-tale signs of internet addiction

- Lying about how much time you spend online
- Cutting back on physical activity and social time
- Neglecting duties at home, work or school
- Over-spending on computer equipment or Internet activities
- Feeling a constant desire to be online
- Going online to escape real world problems
- Ignoring the emotional or physical results of being on your computer too much
- Failing – after several attempts – to control, cut back or stop using the internet
- Denying that you have a problem

What do you do if you think you are addicted to the Internet?

If you have any problem or addiction, seek professional help. Admitting and addressing the problem are the first steps. Lutheran Church of Our Savior has a

covenant agreement with Pastoral Counseling of Miami Valley Hospital, which provides financial assistance to members of Our Savior. If you need to see a counselor you may do so by calling 208-6606.
