Pastor's Message

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

I'm not sure what I expected, but I wasn't prepared for what I encountered. Standing downstream from my fishing partner Steve Swedlund last month in the Platte River located in the northwest corner of lower Michigan, with the sun setting on the first day of a three day fishing excursion, the gray shadow came swimming toward me. As it swam past, it brushed against my leg – shoot, it was as long as my leg! A coho salmon (the first I had seen), embarking on a journey it was born to take, using the last of its energy to make the long trip upstream to spawn in its birthplace before completing its lifecycle – merely doing what a salmon does.

WORSHIP THEMES

Twenty-third Sunday after Pentecost (November 4)

In today's gospel, Jesus invites himself to the home of a known sinner. This day God invites us into grace, even though we do not deserve it. "Today salvation has come to this house." Therefore, we always "enter God's courts with praise."

Twenty-fourth Sunday after Pentecost (November 11)

In these final weeks of the liturgical year, the church cries out, "Come, Lord Jesus!" We are always awaiting God's coming, and God does not disappoint us, making the divine presence known in water, bread, wine, and in this human community of faith.

Twenty-fifth Sunday after Pentecost (November 18)

Signs of the end time fill today's gospel. Christ will come again "to judge the living and the dead," we confess in the creed. How, then, shall we live, knowing that everything around us will one day pass away? We can live with hope if we know that history is heading toward the God who loves us. Yet we also live in the present moment ready for action, making the most of the time given to us as a gift.

Christ the King Sunday (November 25)

On this last Sunday of the church year, we honor Christ, who reigns as king from the cross. The effusive descriptions of Christ in the letter to the Colossians remind us of the absolutely central and vital role he rightfully claims in our life. All space and all time belong to the one who offers paradise to those who live and die with him.

ETERNAL PEACE

A Service of Hope and Remembrance

On Sunday, November 4 at 7:00 p.m. the Chancel Choir will present *Eternal Peace*, a special service in observance of All Saints Sunday. They will be assisted by organist Rachel Spry, as well as instrumentalists and vocalists from the Wright State University music department. Please plan to be there for this incredibly beautiful and meaningful service as we remember with thanksgiving those whom God has taken home and we celebrate the hope of the resurrection for all God's children. Council Update

Here is a quick summary of our activity:

HVAC donations collected to date are 114,708 dollars; this amount has been paid directly for construction; we have taken on loans to date of approximately 200,000 dollars, and we are nearly done with phase one of the project. When we are finished with phase two, (estimated in Feb 2008) we will have approximately 460,000 dollars in outstanding loans.

Property committee agreed to accept a bid for the *restoration of the wood and windows of the south entry of the foyer between the church and the parish house*. Start and finish dates are not estimated, yet. Property committee is also getting an estimate on paving the gravel path to the outside worship area, to improve the accessibility.

Several families are planning to become *new members at LCOS*, at the upcoming new member celebration.

Social Ministry Committee is planning to *collect fish and crackers* on the last weekend of October, for donation to local food pantry; and there is planning to support the meal at St. Paul's Church on October 24.

Stewardship weekend is **November 17-18**; please consider how you will pledge your *donations of time, talent, and support for 2008*.

Worship Committee is planning '*Hanging of the Greens*' on December 9, as an intergenerational event for decorating LCOS for Christmas.

Review of the *LCOS Constitution* is in process, and a new version will likely be

presented at the Annual Congregational Meeting on February 3, 2008.

Nomination committee and council are organizing a slate of *new council member candidates* for election at the December 9, 2007 congregational meeting.

Mark your calendar for **January 27, 2008**, for '*Hearts for the Lord's Will*.' The Evangelism committee is planning a *dinner and entertainment at LCOS*.

Budget planning is in process, and committees and ministries are formulating plans for their activity next year. A budget proposal will be prepared for the Annual Congregational meeting on February 3, 2008.

It is truly a pleasure to see all of the activity going on at LCOS.

STUFF YOU NEED TO KNOW:

Paintball – We are paint balling on November 4 at 1:00. We are going to the

Outback Paintball Field in Xenia. \$6.00 pays for use of the field, helmet and goggles and equipment. Air and paintballs are sold in \$20.00 packages of 500 or \$30.00 packages of 1000. This means your cost will be either \$26.00 dollars or \$36.00 depending on how much you want to play. I am putting down a deposit for each person who is attending so **I need to hear from you ASAP if you want to go!**

Urban Krag – We are rock climbing at the Krag on Saturday, November 17, 5:00 - 8:00 p.m. Cost is \$14.00 and that includes your equipment. We need as many people as possible to get belay certified. CHRISTMAS ADOPT-A-FAMILY PROGRAM

Yes, it is that time again, and we will have 15 needy families, 53 people for 2007. The Social Ministry Committee will shop for the food, but we need your help again with gift shopping. Watch for a Christmas tag tree in the Narthex on November 18 decorated with tags for each family member (**GOLD** for children, **GREEN** for adults). Tags will have information for you to shop for that person. Select the person or persons you would like to shop for and register your tags. **This involves putting your name and phone number on half the tag and leaving that half (with a star) with the person attending the tree.** Coordinate your shopping with the coordinator listed on the tag. **Your half of the tag and a separate gift tag must be attached to the outside of the wrapped gift.** Shopping must be completed by **December 9**; delivery to families will be Saturday, **December 22**. Your help in shopping has been a huge success in past years.

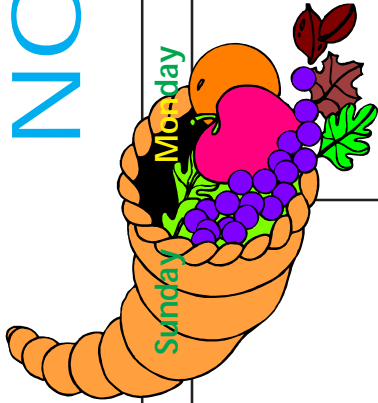

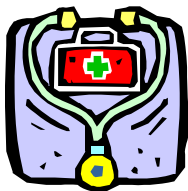

HEALTH MINISTRY NEWS

DONOR SABBATH - NOVEMBER 11

Sponsored by Life Connection of Ohio

During this weekend the Health Ministry Team will share information with the congregation on the need and importance of organ donation.

Life Connection of Ohio is an independent, not-for-profit agency designated by the federal government as the Organ Procurement Organization (OPO) for Northwest and West Central Ohio.

Their mission statement is "Life Connection of Ohio is committed to serving humanity by ending the wait for organ and tissue transplants in a manner that is beneficial to patients, donor families, health care professionals and the public."

Life Connection honors individual's donation decision as recorded in the Ohio Donor Registry; facilitates the recovery of viable organs, tissues and corneas for transplantation medical research or education; provides public and professional education to increase awareness and commitment to organ and tissue donation; and promotes and maintains a collaborative relationship with hospitals and other health care facilities involved in the recovery and transplantation of organs and tissues.

FREE CONFIDENTIAL BLOOD PRESSURE SCREENINGS

Blood Pressure screenings are offered the second weekend of each month. The next screenings will take place on November 10-11 after all the worship services.
